1 Samuel 24 New Living Translation

### David Spares Saul's Life

**24** After Saul returned from fighting the Philistines, he was told that David had gone into the wilderness of En-gedi. <sup>2</sup> So Saul chose 3,000 elite troops from all Israel and went to search for David and his men near the rocks of the wild goats.

<sup>3</sup> At the place where the road passes some sheepfolds, Saul went into a cave to relieve himself. But as it happened, David and his men were hiding farther back in that very cave!

4 "Now's your opportunity!" David's men whispered to him. "Today the LORD is telling you, 'I will certainly put your enemy into your power, to do with as you wish.'" So David crept forward and cut off a piece of the hem of Saul's robe.

<sup>5</sup> But then David's conscience began bothering him because he had cut Saul's robe.
<sup>6</sup> He said to his men, "The LORD forbid that I should do this to my lord the king. I shouldn't attack the LORD's anointed one, for the LORD himself has chosen him." <sup>7</sup> So David restrained his men and did not let them kill Saul.

After Saul had left the cave and gone on his way, <sup>8</sup> David came out and shouted after him, "My lord the king!" And when Saul looked around, David bowed low before him.

<sup>9</sup> Then he shouted to Saul, "Why do you listen to the people who say I am trying to harm you? <sup>10</sup> This very day you can see with your own eyes it isn't true. For the LORD placed you at my mercy back there in the cave. Some of my men told me to kill you, but I spared you. For I said, 'I will never harm the king—he is the LORD's anointed one.' <sup>11</sup> Look, my father, at what I have in my hand. It is a piece of the hem of your robe! I cut it off, but I didn't kill you. This proves that I am not trying to harm you and that I have not sinned against you, even though you have been hunting for me to kill me.

<sup>12</sup> "May the LORD judge between us. Perhaps the LORD will punish you for what you are trying to do to me, but I will never harm you. <sup>13</sup> As that old proverb says, 'From evil people come evil deeds.' So you can be sure I will never harm you. <sup>14</sup> Who is the king of Israel trying to catch anyway? Should he spend his time chasing one who is as

worthless as a dead dog or a single flea? <sup>15</sup> May the LORD therefore judge which of us is right and punish the guilty one. He is my advocate, and he will rescue me from your power!"

<sup>16</sup> When David had finished speaking, Saul called back, "Is that really you, my son David?" Then he began to cry. <sup>17</sup> And he said to David, "You are a better man than I am, for you have repaid me good for evil. <sup>18</sup> Yes, you have been amazingly kind to me today, for when the LORD put me in a place where you could have killed me, you didn't do it. <sup>19</sup> Who else would let his enemy get away when he had him in his power? May the LORD reward you well for the kindness you have shown me today. <sup>20</sup> And now I realize that you are surely going to be king, and that the kingdom of Israel will flourish under your rule. <sup>21</sup> Now swear to me by the LORD that when that happens you will not kill my family and destroy my line of descendants!"

<sup>22</sup> So David promised this to Saul with an oath. Then Saul went home, but David and his men went back to their stronghold.

## Matthew 5:21-26 New Revised Standard Version

#### **Concerning Anger**

<sup>21</sup> "You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder'; and 'whoever murders shall be liable to judgment.' <sup>22</sup> But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister,<sup>[a]</sup> you will be liable to judgment; and if you insult<sup>[b]</sup> a brother or sister,<sup>[c]</sup> you will be liable to the council; and if you say, 'You fool,' you will be liable to the hell<sup>[d]</sup> of fire. <sup>23</sup> So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister<sup>[e]</sup> has something against you, <sup>24</sup> leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister,<sup>[f]</sup> and then come and offer your gift. <sup>25</sup> Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are on the way to court<sup>[g]</sup> with him, or your accuser may hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. <sup>26</sup> Truly I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.
