

Church-wide Bible Study



During Lent this year, Steve and Robin will be leading the congregation in a church-wide book study of David Watson's *Scripture and the Life of God*. The book is divided into 5 chapters and the ministers will be preaching on a chapter for 5 weeks each Sunday beginning March 6. On Wednesdays, Bill Finesilver will continue the study as he offers a time of devotion and discussion. We encourage all small groups to study this book through Lent. We have purchased a book for each person in the congregation. Books will be available on Ash Wednesday or any Sunday during Lent. The books are free but we are always willing to take donations. If you are worshiping with us online and would like to participate, we have purchased several copies of the book via eBook or Kindle. Please contact our church office to receive the code so that you may download the book for free.

Entering into the life of God is like walking into the ocean. The further you go, the more immersed you become. You become more aware of its overwhelming power, its vastness and mystery. The difference is that if you walk too deeply into the ocean you will die, but walking deeply into the life of God brings life. Our desires, our character, the way in which we regard ourselves and other people–all of these change. And this newness of life does not end when our physical bodies die, but extends into eternity. The life of God never ends, and you and I are being drawn into that divine life.

In *Scripture and the Life of God*, David Watson takes us on a journey through what it means to enter into the life of God through texts that God has inspired and made authoritative for the teaching of the Church. Many of us read the Bible during private devotion time, and this is a very helpful practice, but there are also many other ways to walk down the pathway of Scripture into the divine life. Prayer, meditation, music, corporate worship, and other practices facilitate the work of the Holy Spirit through Scripture in drawing us into the divine life.

Perfect Love Bible Study



We live in a fearful, anxiety-driven age where the problems and challenges of the world assault us from every direction and every media source, and they far exceed our abilities to respond to them. The sense of desperation that often comes of this leads to discord and violence: from bitter, cutting remarks to the atrocities of war; from pervasive racism to knee -jerk micro-aggressions. It contributes to our current, peace-bankrupt social discourse, leading to patterns of dismissing, dividing from, condemning, or hating people.

This book provides practices to help Christians value and *actively seek peace, becoming people of reconciliation in ordinary life. Deep Peace:*

- Uncovers the ten things that are most harmful to peace in a person's life.
- Unpacks the "Trinity of Peace" found in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit and how we can find rest in each person of the Trinity.
- Reveals spiritual practices that will teach you how to pursue an inner calm and become the kind of person that meets conflict with love and renounces fear.

Deep Peace is a timely benediction that offers a practical and spiritual guide to recenter believers in the peace of Christ.
