


Church Wide Study



Dahlonega United Women in Faith

Meetings are on the first Tuesday of the month, 10AM, Fellowship Hall All ladies from the church are invited.

February 7th: Janet Burkett will lead us in Call to Prayer and Self Denial. Every year, women are invited to gather in their local units and communities for 'A Call to Prayer and Self-Denial," a faith-filled time to assemble with lifted hearts and hands before our Creator God. This sisterhood observance welcomes all to join in a celebration of selfless giving and spiritual communion with God. Our 2023 theme, '**We Believe Love in Action Changes the World**' honors deaconesses and home missioners who have said yes to the call God has placed on their lives. You are heartily welcomed into this holy moment as we come together as one in spirit and in faith, on behalf of women, children and youth across the globe.

March 7th: Our guest speaker is Angela Ewers, founder of Rock Goodbye Angel, a 501(C)3 ministry in Gainesville that supports families of pregnancy and infant loss. Her passion and calling is to help guide individuals and couples through the grieving process while restoring and strengthening their faith in God. Angela is a Licensed and Ordained Minister and has a masters degree in Pastoral Counseling.

<u>Sewing Heart Pillows, by Kara Martina</u> Excerpts from *Response* Magazine

The idea of making heart-shaped pillows came from a church member who noticed the pillows while visiting another church. Even though that church member moved away from DUMC, she encouraged others to continue sewing



heart-shaped pillows. In the past three years, the ministry has grown, attracting women who want to fellowship and share in the joy of making, stuffing, and distributing pillows to those in need of a reminder of how much they are loved.

In the last year, we provided more the 230 pillows to each child in the church and to anyone who attends "Blue Christmas" service or regular church services on monthly basis. We've sent pillows to teachers at our church-supported school in El Salvador. Eighty pillows have been distributed to Murphy-Harpst Children's Center for children who are victims of abuse. Pillows are also given to Jeremiah's Place, No One Alone, Meals on Wheels recipients, Rainbow House, Iraq and other war-torn countries, Kentucky's Appalachian Mountains, retirement/nursing home. Recipients have written letters back to their pillow-givers, sharing stories of gratitude. One man tells us he sleeps with his pillow every naptime.


A favorite pillow for male recipients is made from repurposed men's shirts, so it includes buttons up the middle and an existing shirt pocket. Bereavement pillows are made by request with fabric chosen and donated by their recipients.

Pillows are distributed free of charge, so donations are helpful. A local store going out of business recently donated 800 years of cotton fabric, guaranteeing the continuation of the pillow ministry.

Heart Kits are available to circle members and other volunteers to pick up the material and sew prior to monthly meetings. At the meetings, members stuff hearts and make bookmarks and crosses. While we stuff, stitch, cut, and apply stickers to bookmarks, we do a round of "Tell me something I don't know about you," in hopes of forming stronger friendships. Most things shared have made us laugh, but some stories go deeper. It all draws us closer to one another and to God.

If you or someone you know is in need of a heart pillow, they will be distributed the first Sunday of each month from 9:00 to 11:00am.

BOOK CLUB



The Book Club reading for February will be American Saint, Francis Asbury & the Methodists, by John Wigger.

English-born Francis Asbury was one of the most important religious leaders in American history. Asbury single-handedly guided the creation of the American Methodist church, which became the largest Protestant denomination in nineteenth-century America, and laid the foundation of the Holiness and Pentecostal movements that flourish today. In American Saint, John Wigger has written the definitive biography of Asbury and, by extension, a revealing interpretation of the early years of the Methodist movement in America. Asbury emerges here as not merely an influential religious leader, but a fascinating character, who lived an extraordinary life. His cultural sensitivity was matched only by his ability to organize. His life of prayer and voluntary poverty were legendary, as was his generosity to the poor. He had a remarkable ability to connect with ordinary people, and he met with thousands of them as he crisscrossed the nation, riding more than one hundred and thirty thousand miles between his arrival in America in 1771 and his death in 1816. Indeed Wigger notes that Asbury was more recognized face-to-face than any other American of his day, including Thomas Jefferson and George Washington.
