
In honor of Veterans' Day

Just in time for the release of *Amazing* Grace, the movie about the life of William Wilberforce. This edition of his classic book from 1797, Real Christianity, is paraphrased in modern language and made more accessible to contemporary readers. This is the book that helped abolish the slave trade in the United Kingdom and called Christians to live a more authentic life of faith more than two hundred years ago. The timeless truths it contains will speak to readers in fresh ways today. Christians who eschew cultural Christianity in favor of a real faith in Christ, will find the principles here thoughtprovoking and applicable. The social justice orientation will appeal to readers of Jim Wallis, Os Guinness, Charles Colson, Shane Claiborne, John Perkins, Bono, and Nancy Pearcey. Readers will also find the book is a good litmus test of the authenticity of their own faith.

Spirit of Christmas is the Community Helping Place's holiday outreach program which provides eligible families food to make a Christmas meal, vouchers for clothing & books, and gifts for the children (ages birth to 18). Last year our average families served per month was 533; this year, so far, our average is 810 families per month. So this has grown a lot since last year. Financial uncertainty has moved beyond those whose situation is already fragile to include those who have not had to worry about financial insecurity. Your donation of food, toys and

money will go a long way in providing a special Christmas for these families. Below is a list of food items that each family will receive this year, along with some cold items CHP will provide on the day of distribution. There is also a suggested toy list below; this is not an inclusive list. You are welcome to use your own creativity; we just ask for no clothing as we do not get sizes of each child.

Red Bird Mission Beverly Kentucky

We invite you to join us on a Christmas Mission of Love. On November 27th Ed Wright will lead a team to take 100 canned hams, 100 fresh hams and 100 turkeys to Appalachia at Beverly Kentucky for Christmas suppers in support of families in need. The area was supported by coal mining but now has no mining jobs due to mine closures. The Red Bird Mission, a Methodist organization, has a food pantry that supports the community. They have support for Thanksgiving but lack any support for Christmas. The cost for this Mission last year was about \$6,400 but this year it will be higher due to the rise in food cost. Most of the cost is funded but donations are still appreciated. On the 27th the trip to Red Bird will be made up and back in one day.
